


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TNAW Staff

My Brothers,

This letter is to promote Vigil Nominations and make you all aware of the requirements for nomination. First, remember that the Vigil Honor is the Order of the Arrow's highest honor and is to be bestowed only to those Brotherhood members who have shown exemplary service to the Lodge, Council, or greater scouting community. This is not an award that is earned through any conscious effort but by the selfless service given and the valuable experience gained in scouting. Upon receiving the Vigil Honor it is imperative that each honoree continue to serve the lodge to the best of their ability; such is purpose of this high honor.

All Lodge members that are dues paid, in good standing and who have been registered as a Brotherhood member for a minimum of two years are eligible to be called-out for Vigil. I encourage all of you to nominate your brothers who fulfill these requirements for the Vigil Honor. The Vigil Nomination Form can be found at tipisa.org and is due to me through email or by mail to the Council office by January 12, 2013 at 10:00 am. With the nomination form I require a picture of the individual being nominated and at least one personal letter of recommendation that shows the member's impressive service and leadership capabilities.

Finally, I am in need of volunteers, one from each chapter, for the Vigil Selection Committee, which will meet at the Council office. Preferably the Committee will consist of past Vigil honorees that are well aware of the attributes necessary for the Vigil Honor, however any volunteers would be appreciated. 
