h. Key 3 Meal Consideration - Michael Todd

The goal of this is to streamline the registration form creation process. 5 minute break beginning at 8:44 to allow chiefs to discuss with their advisers.
- ii. Rick Obermayer's inquiry Chapters will still be on their own for cracker-barrel.
- iii. Phil Daly's inquiry Supplements will be allowed assuming they are not excessive pending Matt Raegan approval.
- iv. Huracan notes that one possible way to supplement is by buying real steak through camp for your chapter to cook. If you speak with Raegan ahead of time, you ought to be able to coordinate a similar deal.
- v. Kyle Gilmore's inquiry Camp staff will be preparing all the meals. This is non-negotiable.
- vi. Michael Burton III's Inquiry Is it possible to set one standardized price and have chapters pick meals on their own for a standard price? This would not make it any easier for chapters to plan for their Ordeals because they still have to justify the price after picking out the meals.
